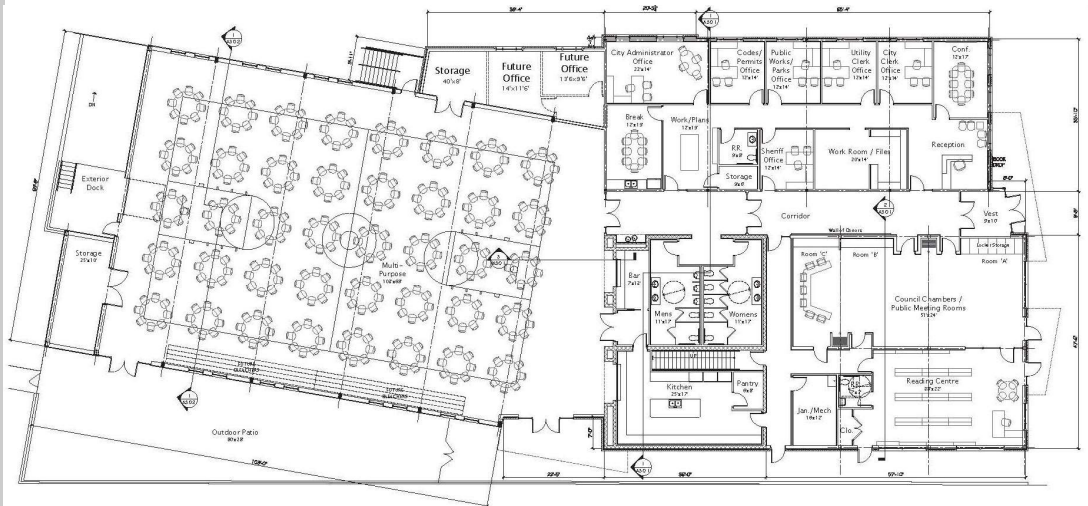

## Snow Removal Courtesy and Fire Hydrant Accessibility

Please be courteous to your neighbors by not blowing or throwing snow onto other citizen’s property, sidewalks, driveways or in the city streets.

You can assist City Public Works & the Hickman Volunteer Fire Department by removing the snow around Fire Hydrants in your neighborhood. By locating and exposing Fire Hydrants the Fire Department can save valuable time in an emergency situation.

The City Public Works Department, starting with the main thoroughfares, will plow the city streets and trails when there is an accumulation of three or more inches of snow. Please move your vehicles off of the city streets within 48 hours of any winter storm to assist the Public Works crews with continuous snow removal.
